North Atlantic Humpback Whale Catalog: overview of current holdings

The North Atlantic Humpback Whale Catalog, curated by Allied Whale/College of the Atlantic, contains fluke photographs of North Atlantic humpback whales contributed from dedicated research efforts and more opportunistic platforms, such as whale watch cruises. It currently includes over 38,000 photographic-identification images of 9,500 whales contributed by over 700 groups and individuals. Table 1 lists the number of unique individuals catalogued by area for the period 1970 through 2018.

Jones et al. have recently completed a study estimating transition probabilities among all major areas of humpback whale aggregation in the North Atlantic Ocean through 2015, including the five primary feeding grounds in mid- to high-latitudes (Gulf of Maine, Atlantic Canada, West Greenland, Iceland, and northern Norway) and breeding/calving grounds in the West Indies and the Cape Verde Islands. The results further support the findings of Stevick et al. (2018) that suggest the presence of distinct breeding populations in the Greater Antilles and the southeastern Caribbean. Migratory patterns between feeding areas and the southeastern Caribbean were more similar to those from the CVI breeding segment than the geographically-closer area in the Greater Antilles. Breeding to feeding area transition probabilities were highest from the Greater Antilles to western feeding grounds, from the southeastern Caribbean to eastern feeding grounds, and from CVI to eastern feeding grounds. Published results of this study are anticipated by the time of the next Scientific Committee meeting.
