SOWER abundance estimates Workshop

In recent years, the Scientific Committee has been developing and testing new methods to estimate minke whale abundance in the Antarctic from SOWER/IDCR cruises. The new methods are needed because some of the assumptions of basic line transect methods are violated in the Antarctic minke whale data and these violations lead to bias in absolute abundance and in trends. Although good progress has been made with the new methods, to the point where preliminary abundance estimates from one method were discussed by the Committee this year, there are still a number of important details (in particular concerning analysis of recent data from SOWER experiments, appropriate simulation tests, diagnostic checks including some of those used in evaluating abundance estimates of North Atlantic common minke whales, and space/time extrapolation/interpolation) that need to be resolved before the Committee can agree on a set of abundance estimates with reasonable scientific confidence.

A Workshop related to this will be held from 7-10 February 2008 at the National Marine Mammal Laboratory, Seattle, USA.
